Greetings, CBC Family and Friends,

Perhaps you have entered a challenging season – death, illness, lack of opportunity, compassion fatigue, career changes, etc. It is these times of life that can rattle our faith in God. "Rattled faith" is no reflection of a lack of faith; it is simply part of the human experience.
